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Success Level of Women Entrepreneur in Coimbatore District

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Abstract: Women Entrepreneurship plays a prime role in industrial development. Indiahas always been a land of entrepreneurs and also occupied a strategic position in the Indian economy. The government of India has defined womenentrepreneurship based on women participation in equity and employed of abusiness enterprise. The researcher has taken this topic to identify the factorsmotivating women to become an entrepreneur, to identify the factorscontributing to the success of women entrepreneurs and to analyze therelationship between industries related factors and success of entrepreneurs. The researcher has been selected 800 respondents from in and aroundCoimbatore City by convenience sampling method. The ANOVA TEST and POST HOC ANOVA TEST are used for the study. In this study the researcher found that the above 50 years age group of women entrepreneurs is having more satisfaction than other age group, diploma holders are having more satisfaction than degree and professional.

Introduction

Over the past few decades the gender role of women has been breaking the barriers of four walls. Today the roles of women are not confined to the traditional on as a mother/housewife. The role of modern women is much more than, what it was previously. However even after the 69 years of India's independence the bias against women continues because of the cultural and traditional mores, which has affected lot on the female status and role. Primary Data

In order to fulfill the objectives set, a sample study was carried out with the help of a well framed questionnaire for interview schedule. The questionnaire was prepared with the guidance of the experts in the relevant field. Necessary corrections were made in the questionnaire to complete the research work successfully. The respondents for the study were selected on the basis of varying background, based on their age, dwelling place, educational qualification, monthly income, nature of business and so forth, from the study area of Coimbatore district. The questionnaire was given to the respondents to provide the required data as and when the researcher explained each and every question to the respondents.

Secondary Data

The primary data were supplemented by a rise in of secondary source of data. The secondary data pertaining to the study was obtained from books of account, data published in the internet by the selected business operated by women entrepreneurs, the journals, magazines and the articles in the related topics published in the refereed journals and also from the library resources and internet sources. A number of text books were also read to gain pertinent literature on the women entrepreneurship.

Sample Selection

Due to the development in the economy, social status and the changing trends among the women entrepreneurs are considered important as they contribute considerable income to their family and also to the nation in the form of various taxes and services. As the population for the study is confined to 7200 (Source from District industrial Centre Coimbatore, out of the total population 800 respondents were selected at random by using convenient sampling method in Coimbatore district.

Suggestions

- Another problem of women entrepreneurs was lack of access to information technology in order to successful in business not only nationally but also internationally they need to be educated on information
- Women entrepreneur could be trained and educated in order make them successful with regard to access to capital, marketing of their products, creation of assets, selecting the form of enterprise and the nature of industry.

Conclusion

The present research has made an attempt to identify the problems, motivation and success factors in Coimbatore district. It has been found out that the women entrepreneurs suffer from every step and they have to struggle for their survival and success. The study reveals that they are not able to raise bank loans easily because of the terms and conditions especially surrender of securities. They do not have adequate fixed assets (many of them are running their business premises in the rented building) so that the security is the hindrance to them. At the same time, the banks demand the personal guarantee against the personal loans and it is not possible to the women to arrange such surety. Even the chap labour is available, the women have usual labour problems and the Government should take care about the problem.
